I was so proud of our high school youth and their worship leadership this Youth Sunday. I continue to be inspired and encouraged by their energy and creativity. This year our service was themed around the Transfiguration (Matthew 17), which



is a theologically complex text. Our two preachers, Olivia Liang and Jackson Mills, spent hours studying and processing the Scripture before delivering powerful sermons about the beauty of mountaintops and the courage it takes to leave them.

Our liturgists wrote their own prayers and liturgy, using the Biblical text as their inspiration. Our music team worked to choose hymns and special selections

that reflected the themes of the service. Many thanks to Doug and Rebecca Adams, who agreed to build a five-piece communion table that the youth assembled and disassembled during the opening and closing hymns. Thanks as well to our Sunday School teachers who helped to plan and lead the service.

It was an honor to officiate and serve communion alongside our youth. Our liturgy spoke to communion as a sacrament of the past, present, and future. The future of our church was well-represented on March 1, 2015!

and contact information) for our church members and friends. Now we are entering the second phase of launching CCB – having test groups use it. CCB is not only a central location where we can store all of our church member/friend data, it is also built to be a relational database where members of the church can login, update contact information, download profile photos, share skills and interests, sign-Page 4 SC The Tidings


up for groups, interact with groups, view the church calendar and event needs, and check giving history and statements. CCB is a secure database that is only accessible by members and friends of the church who are given a login. Currently, during the testing/launch phase, a private URL is being used for the CCB database. Eventually it will be accessible from a "members only" page on BMPA's website. In May, we plan to launch CCB church-wide by giving login credentials to all church members and asking everyone to explore the site and update and customize their profile information. The staff is committed to helping members feel at ease with the database, and to demonstrating how intuitive CCB is to use. We will schedule several help sessions after worship and during the week for those needing extra assistance learning how to use CCB. Look for more information ahead about our CCB launch next month. A LOOK AHEAD – CHORAL ANTHEMS FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL

State, Fred began his early organ studies with Dr. Edward Hansen of Seattle. He won the student organ competition sponsored by the Seattle Chapter of

the American Guild of Organists while still in high school. While earning a bachelor's degree in organ performance at Syracuse University, he won first prize in the 1972 Ft. Wayne National Organ Competition and was awarded the Arthur Poister Prize for Outstanding Organist for four consecutive years.

From 1972-75 Fred studied organ in Paris, France, with Marie-Claire Alain and spent one year working with organist and composer Maurice Duruflé. Fred earned a master's degree in organ performance at the University of Michigan during the 1975-76 school year. He returned to Paris in 1976 as Director of Music at the American Church in Paris.

"O Pray for the Peace of Jerusalem" – Herbert Howells

Herbert Howells was born in Lydney, Gloucester on 17 October 1892. He showed a keen interest in composition early in his life and, at the age of eighteen, became a pupil of Herbert Brewer, Organist of Gloucester Cathedral. In 1912 he was awarded a scholarship to the Royal College of Music and studied under Charles Villiers Stanford, Walter Parratt, Charles Wood and C. Hubert Parry.

Unlike his close friend and mentor, Ralph Vaughan Williams, Howells never collected or made direct use of folk songs. His move away from secular to sacred music after Hymnus Paradisi (1938) continued into the 1940's with a series of compositions setting mass texts and canticles, most notably the Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis from the Anglican Evensong service.

During his lifetime he was awarded a Collard Life Fellowship (Worshipful Company of Musicians), CBE (1953) and in 1972 was made a Companion of Honour. Herbert Howells died in London on February 23, 1983, at the age of 90.

"THE LORD IS MY SHEPHERD" – THOMAS MATTHEWS

Thomas Matthews was born at Utica, New York, April 1, 1915. At the age of 8, he sang under Norman Coke-Jephcott recently arrived from Coventry Cathedral. At 17 he assisted Coke-Jephcott at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York. In 1936, he accepted the post of Organist/Choirmaster at St. Martin-in-the-Fields (Chestnut Hill) in Philadelphia.

During WWII Dr. Matthews conducted the famous Blue Jacket Choir. After the war he served on the Northwestern University School of Music faculty and was director of music for Seabury-Western Theological Seminary. He founded the North Shore Illinois Chapter of the AGO. In 1960, Dr. Matthews moved to Tulsa where he became Trinity Church's Organist/Choirmaster. While in Tulsa, he founded the music department at Holland Hall School, served on the faculty of the University of Tulsa, and supervised the design and installation of the IV/82 Moller which continues to serve the greater Tulsa community. Dr. Matthews composed over thirty published anthems before he passed away on April 10, 1999.



These days, David is a freelancer. His major focus is as the

From the Past

A friend, Mrs. Louise Owens, discovered a tract in a book that belonged to her grandfather, entitled *Bible Characters*. She noticed that it was written by Rev. John McDowell of Brown Memorial and passed it on to me. Rev. McDowell was the pastor of Brown Memorial from 1915-1921.

Rev. McDowell's remarks apparently were written for soldiers serving in World War One. He wrote in "What God Says to His Soldiers" about the "Abiding Comrade:"

"Jesus Christ is just such a Comrade. He knows us, our temperament and our temptations. He believes in us, our possibilities and our promises, and He loves us with a love stronger than sin and death."
