MISSION STATEMENT

"Emboldened by the life and teachings of Jesus Christ, we strive to bear witness to the reconciling love of God by nurturing an inclusive community, wrestling with Scripture and tradition, and working for justice and peace."

Relationships are the means through which our lives come together by faith in God through Jesus Christ. Jesus taught that we cannot encounter God apart from relationships with each other and the neighbors we serve.

We focus our common life together around five relationships:

I. Relationships with God

We seek spiritual nourishment in worship and fellowship, offering opportunities for renewal and refreshment.

- Explore new and meaningful ways to encounter God in corporate worship.
- Foster individual spiritual practices through opportunities and teachings throughout the liturgical calendar.
- Deepen our understanding of our faith through engagement with Scripture and theological teaching.

2. Relationships with one another

We seek to create wholesome relationships that embrace authenticity and vulnerability, recognizing that we're all works in progress.

- Provide multiple entry points for inquirers and new members to discern where their interests and life of the church intersect.
- Develop intentional and intergenerational fellowship through small groups, teams, committees, activities and events.
- Manifest a spirit of hospitality by welcoming newcomers and enhancing connections in light of a growing congregation.
- Embody the conviction that all are welcome.

3. Relationships with our church home

We seek to share the assets of our facility to connect us to God's mission in the world.

 Define use options and policies for use of the newly renovated second floor of Fellowship Hall. Strive for continued improvements in accessibility.

4. Relationships with our city

We seek to uphold our missional identity as people inextricably connected with God's involvement in Baltimore City and its future.

- Participate in the work of justice and social change in Baltimore City through relationship building, organizing (with BUILD), advocating, participating and serving.
- Foster relationships with other faith communities and with our neighbors in Central West Baltimore.

5. Relationships with our world

We seek to participate in the work of pursuing a world where all God's people and creation are validated, respected and sustained.

- Nurture and affirm relationships and ministry beyond Baltimore, as fostered by the interest and leadership of congregational membership (e.g., Dakota Presbytery, El Salvador, Cuba).
- Encourage and empower individuals to pursue new ideas that inspire the congregation to move toward justice and peace (e.g., Opioid Group, Sanctuary Movement).
- Pursue opportunities to protect and celebrate God's creation through education, outreach and sustainable practices.
